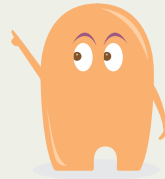

## WHO ARE WE?

We are a Specialist Child and Adolescent Mental Health Service (CAMHS) Team funded and commissioned by Health and CYPF. Our role is to respond to the mental health needs of children and young people who are Looked After by Sheffield City Council. We work with children and young people between 0 and 18 years.

## HOW DO WE WORK?

Children's mental health affects and is affected by a number of different factors. These include the ability to make sense of what has happened in the past, access to formal education and the stability of foster or residential placements. We therefore take a holistic and systemic approach to our work and consider what is happening at multiple levels.



## WHAT DO WE OFFER?

### Advice/Referral Line

Any carer or professional can talk to someone in the team about concerns regarding a looked after child's emotional wellbeing on a **Monday or Friday between 10am and 12pm on 2260876.**

### Face to Face Consultations

We have one hour slots for Social Workers to book and discuss concerns about a Looked After Child or young person's emotional wellbeing. These consultations are primarily for Social Workers however you can bring along others if you discuss this first with one of the team.

## MULTI-SYSTEMIC INTERVENTION (MSI)

If further therapeutic involvement at several levels is needed, we will put the child forward for MSI.

MSI will often start with an initial Network Meeting. This involves inviting all the key professionals who have a role in the child or young person's life. At the initial meeting we will pull together all the information people have about what has happened and is happening to this child/young person; their early experiences, reason for coming into care and experiences in care. Our aim is to develop a deeper and shared understanding of issues that may be influencing the present difficulties. The network then jointly develops an action plan of interventions.

The plan may involve; working with school, supporting the social worker, working with foster carers around therapeutic parenting, family work and or individual work.

Further network meetings are then held as regularly as is needed.

## HOW CAN A CHILD OR YOUNG PERSON BE REFERRED TO OUR SERVICE?

As the Social Worker holds parental responsibility for the child or young person, you have to make the referral. This can be through the Advice/Referral Line or the face to face Consultations.
